The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Causin, from the committee on internal improvement, made a favorable report upon the preamble and resolutions from the senate, requesting our Representatives in Congress to endeavor to procure from the General Government, further aid towards the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time,

assented to and returned to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act to promote internal improvement, by the construction of a Rail Read from Baltimore to the City of Washington;

Was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Williams, said bill was amended by adding at

the end thereof, the following proviso:

"Provided, that nothing in this act shall be so construed as to release said company from its obligation to make a second track, whenever the legislature of this State shall require it.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed

and returned to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Causin, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, entitled, an act extending the time of the statutes of limitations, as applied to claims against real estate,

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed

and sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Boston and New York Coai Company, passed Dec. session, 1835;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed

and returned to the senate.

Mr. White, chairman of the select committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an additional supplement to an act to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, passed at December session, 1832 ch. 275;

Which was read the first time;

The said bill was then read the second time by special order, rejec-

ted and returned to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Sprigg, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the promotion of internal improvement;

Was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Duke moved to refer said bill to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

On motion of Mr. Biser, the house was called and the door-

keeper sent for the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Carroll, the house resolved to proceed with
