

Also, the report and resolution of the joint committee on the library authorising the librarian to purchase of the executors of Horace Radout certain documents and papers therein named;

Also, the resolution to pay for the newspapers furnished the Legislature during the present session;

Also, the resolution in favour of Abingdon Academy,

Severally endorsed, 'assented to,' and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered resolutions originated in and passed by the senate, in relation to the rivers entering into Tangier Sound and Pocomoke Bay,

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and assented to;

Also, the following bills originated in and passed by the senate, viz:—

A bill, entitled, an act to authorise the Register of the Land Office of the Western Shore to issue a warrant of resurvey and patent for certain land in Allegany county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Sprigg, Huddleson, and Neff;

A bill, entitled, an act to authorise William Price to execute a certain deed to Elizabeth Lawrence,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

A bill, entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Williams, of Worcester county, from her husband Thomas N. Williams,

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

The bill reported by Mr. Selby, entitled, an act to alter the place of holding elections in the fourth or Berlin district, in Worcester county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The speaker laid before the house a communication from Stephen Boyd, of Hartford county, on the subject of erecting booms in the Susquehanna river, and praying the passage of the act now pending for that purpose,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Parker, entitled, an act to prevent horse racing in the public roads of Cecil county;

Also, the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to establish an additional magistrates' court in Cecil county,

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and severally passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Wilmer, entitled, an act for the benefit of Ann Ennalls Harris, wife of William T. Harris;

Also, the bill reported by Mr. Mann, entitled, an act for the benefit of Jane Hillerd, of Washington county;

And the bill reported by Mr. Blocher, from the committee on expiring laws, entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of Assembly which would expire with the present session of the General Assembly,
