

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to exempt from taxation the Parsonage House of the Episcopal Church in Chestertown;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

Mr. Sprigg submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby authorised to pay to Melinda Shercliff, or order, widow of William Shercliff, a soldier of the revolution, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the half pay of a lieutenant, as a further remuneration for his services during her life.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Kerr, chairman pro. tem. of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill, entitled, an act ceding to the United States, the jurisdiction of the State of Maryland, in, to and over certain lands on Whetstone point, near the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and passed.

Mr. Blocher submitted the following order,

Ordered, that the additional number of documents which have been ordered by this house to be printed, and which have not been furnished, be forwarded to the several members of this Legislature by the printer, as soon as the same shall be printed.

Which was twice read.

Mr. Carpinter moved that said order be rejected;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Alexander moved to lay said order on the table;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the adoption of said order;

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Blocher submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay the postage on all letters and documents printed by order of the Legislature, that may be forwarded to the several members of this Legislature, from and after the adjournment, that may be of a public character.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time,

On motion of Mr. Grason, said resolution was amended by striking out the words 'letters and;'

The said resolution was then read the second time as amended, and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Carroll,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.
