

Severally endorsed, 'assented to,' and ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert M. Walmsley;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to exempt the sheriff of Cecil county from the collection of officers' fees;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise and empower Henry Thompson, of the city of Annapolis, to sell and dispose of his negro girl Emily Johnson, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act relating to free negroes and mulattoes;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to secure to citizens of Allegany county, the right of trial for debt under warrant, in the election districts only in which the party so sued, may reside;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to provide the right of appeal in criminal cases;

Severally endorsed, "will not pass."

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of commissioners and the division of Worcester county into school districts, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1836, ch. 279;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

Also, a report and resolutions relative to a retrocession of a part of the Territory of the District of Columbia to the State of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Beam, Dawson, Ghise-  
lin, Giles, Duke, Carroll and Parker.

Mr. Huddleson submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate:

By the House of Delegates,  
March 29, 1838.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We herewith return to your honorable body the bill, entitled, an act to secure to citizens of Allegany county, the right of trial under warrant, in the election district only in which the party so sued, may reside, and respectfully ask the reconsideration and passage of the same.

The committee to which was referred the resolutions from the senate, on the retrocession of George Town to Maryland, have had the same under consideration, and a majority of the committee report favorably thereon, with the following amendment:
