So the amendments were rejected.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to alter, repeal and abolish all that part of the constitution and form of government, which inhibits the senate from amending a money bill;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the better regulation of Chancery proceedings in certain cases, passed at December session, 1820, ch. 161;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, severally rejected, and the bills severally returned to the senate.

On motion of Mr. McDaniel, the house took up for consideration the resolution submitted by him on the 19th inst. in favor of Nicholas Dudley;

The said resolution was then read the second time and dissented from.

Mr. Alexander, chairman of the committee on ways and means, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act to invest the State's share of the Surplus Revenue of the United States, and for other purposes;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;

Mr. Williams moved to amend said bill by inserting after the words "same in," in the 4th line, 2d section, the words "Treasury notes;"

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Giles, said bill was amended by inserting after the word "thereon," in the 2d section, 10th line, these words "after deducting the sum of one thousand dollars per annum, which is otherwise appropriated, by an act of the present session, entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons in this State."

On motion of Mr. Causin, said bill was further amended by striking out in the second section, these words, "created under the provisions of the act for the promotion of internal improvement, passed at the adjourned May session, 1836, ch. 395."

Mr. Carroll moved further to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof, the following proviso:

Provided always, that nothing in this act contained, shall be understood to authorise said treasurer to invest said fund in any of the Canal or Rail Road stocks of this State, created under the provisions of the act for the promotion of internal improvement, passed at the adjourned May session of 1836, ch. 395, or any other of the stocks of this State;

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Williams, said amendment was amended by striking out from the word "any," to the end thereof, and insert-
