Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Julia Ann Stevens

from her husband Charles R. Stevens;

And the bill, entitled, an act to authorise James M. Selden, of Baltimore county, to bring into this State the several slaves therein named;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time,

and severally passed and returned to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a weighmaster of live stock in the city of Baltimore,

Endorsed, 'will pass with the proposed amendments,' which amendment was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed:

Also, the bill, entitled, a supp'ement to an act, entitled, an act

for the promotion of internal improvement;

Also the bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to invest the State's share of the surplus revenue of the United States, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1836, ch 220;

Also the bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools in this State,

Severally endorsed, 'will pass,' and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution in favor of the committee clerks, Endorsed, 'assented to,' and ordered to be engrossed;
