The bill reported by Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on inspections, entitled, a further supplement to an act respecting hay and straw brought for sale to the city of Baltimore, and to repeal an act, passed at December session 1837,

Was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Ely, said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof as an additional section the following—

‘And be it enacted, That nothing contained in the proviso of this act shall be so construed as to prevent the weighing and inspection of hay and straw in the manner now provided by the ordinances of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, or under the existing laws of the State, until the scales are provided for that purpose according to the provisions of this act.’

The said bill was then read the second time as amended and passed.
