Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second

time, severally passed and sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the better regulation of Chancery proceedings in certain cases, passed at Dec. session, 1820, ch. 161;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, rejected

and returned to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Hearn, the house took up for consideration the resolution submitted by Mr. Carroll, chairman of the committee or education, on the 20th inst. in favor of New Town Academy, in Worcester county;

The said resolution was then read the second time, assented to,

and sent to the senate.

Mr. Williams submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate:

By the House of Delegates,

March 29th, 1838.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We herewith return to you the bill, entitled, an act to abolish in the State of Maryland, the law of imprisonment for debt, and respectfully ask that you will be pleased to reconsider and pass the same.

On motion of Mr. Hillen,

Ordered, that the Secretary of State cause to be deposited in the State Library, all books, maps, &c. presented to the State, which have been, or may hereafter be received in the Executive Chamber; and the Librarian to make entries of the same, with the date of the receipt thereof.

On motion of Mr. Simmons, the house took up for consideration the resolution submitted by him on the 1st Feb. in relation to pay-

ing the public creditors in current coin;

On motion of Mr. Duke, said resolution was referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

On motion of Mr. Williams, (Mr. Ely being in the chair,)

Ordered unanimously, that a committee be appointed to wait on the Honorable Speaker, and request him to furnish a copy of his valedictory address made to the House this evening, to be entered on the journal;

Whereupon, Messrs. Williams, Kerr and Ghiselin were appointed, who after some time, reported to the house that they had performed this service, and that the Honorable Speaker had desired them to inform the house that he would gratify their very complimentary request.
