Petition of John E. Taylor, for an act authorising him to bring into this State a certain slave therein mentioned, 84; bill reported, 316; passed, 457; sent to the senate, 461; returned passed, 525.

Bill to encourage the emigration of free negroes from this State, and to advance the interest of tradesmen, mechanics and other laboring persons, reported, 447; bill considered and amended, 527, enacting clause struck out, 528.

Leave for a bill to authorise Robert W. Harper, of Prince George's county, to carry with him to the State of Mississippi a certain negro, who is a slave for a term of years, 56; bill reported and referred, 60; reported with amendments, 165; which are assented to, bill passed, 208; sent to the senate, 216; bill returned again rejected, 322; message asking a reconsideration, proposed and assented to, 337; sent to the senate, 342; returned rejected, 536.

Petition of William P. Sterrett and Wm. Leckwood, for permission to bring into this State for a limited period, a negro man therein named, 418; unfavorable report thereon, 574.

Leave for an additional supplement to the act of 1831, ch. 323, relating to free negroes and slaves, asked and referred, 266; unfavorable report thereon, 574.

Bill to authorise Hanson Jones, a free man of color, to bring into Washington county, his wife, Priscilla Hanson, formerly Priscilla Johnson, received from the senate, passed and returned, 577.

Bill authorising Charles Carroll to bring certain slaves for life into this State, received from the senate, 585, amended, *ib*; passed and returned to the senate, 586.

Petition of G. G. Johnson, for an act to enable him to bring a female servant into this State, 240; unfavorable report thereon, concurred in, 600.

Petition of John H. Digges, for permission to bring certain negro slaves therein mentioned, 477; bill reported, 480; passed, 595; sent to the senate, 597; returned passed, 609.

Petition of Ruth Hyland and Henry Hollingsworth, admr's. of Maj. Nicholas Hyland, for permission to manumit certain persons of color, 454; bill reported, 456; amended and passed, 594-5; sent to the senate, 597; returned rejected, 609.
