

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in relation to furnishing certain Tents to the colonel of the Fiftieth regiment of militia,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the militia.

A resolution in favor of Bowling, Mills and Gardiner, and

A resolution directing the Treasurer for the Western Shore, to pay to the members of the council, each the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also, delivered a bill entitled, an act to divorce Col. Benjamin Smith of Cecil county, from his wife Rebecca Smith,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Jones presented the memorial of Samuel Wilson, for an act to make valid the acknowledgment of a certain deed of trust,

Which was read and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sirena Upton of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Levi Upton, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the petition of John Lammott, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise John Lammott, former collector in the third election district in Baltimore county, to complete his collections,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to enable James S. Morsell, junr. of Calvert county, to collect certain fees due the estate of William S. Morsell, deceased,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Beckett, Kent and Goldsborough.

A bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.
