

TUESDAY, February 20, 1833.

The Senate met Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Cottman from the committees to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of John S. Crockett and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell, and

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Samuel G. Holbrook, late sheriff of Somerset county, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution enquiring into the expediency of purchasing from the Executors of Horace Ridout, certain papers therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the library.

A resolution in favor of Elizabeth Burk,

A resolution in favor of Rebecca Uncles,

A resolution in favor of Jane Bishop, and

A resolution in favor of Sarah Callahan,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on revolutionary claims.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act to abolish the levy court, provide for the appointment of commissioners of Somerset county and prescribing their duties, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Bowie presented the memorial of Edward P. Roberts, for an act of incorporation,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the preamble and resolutions relating to Joseph Ennals, reported that the committee were of opinion they ought not to be assented to.

They were read the second time.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the memorial of Edward P. Roberts, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Silk Company of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Lee presented the report of the Visitors of St. John's Literary Institution, to the General Assembly,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
