Leave was granted to the committee on the militia, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, passed at December session 1823, chapter 188.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

It was ordered, that when the Senate adjourns, it shall be adjour-

ned until Friday morning ten o'clock.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising Henry Feece, surviving executor of Jacob Alexander, late of Frederick county deceased, to execute the last will and testament of said deceased, passed December session 1836, chapter 214, reported favorably thereon.

The bill entitled, an act to alter, repeal and abolish all that part of the constitution and form of government which inhibits the Senate from originating or amending a money bill, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

It was amended by striking out the words "originating or," in the 3d line of the 1st section.

The bill was then read through and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The title of said bill was amended, by striking out the words "ori-ginating or."

The bill was then sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

It was ordered, that Messrs. Cottman, Jones and Goldsborough, be a committee, with instructions to report the amount of all the expenses incurred and paid out of the Treasury, for the making a Map and Geological Survey of the State, when said Map and Survey will be completed, and whether it would not be expedient to repeal the acts and resolutions, authorising the Map and Survey to be made.
