Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate adjourned until Friday morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, February 23, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Wednesday. The proceedings of Wednesday were read.

Mr. Brown submitted the following message; which was read and adopted:

February 23, 1838.

We have received your message proposing to appoint a joint committee to confer upon and propose such a system of banking and financial operations as might meet the approbation of the Legislature, and concur therein. We have appointed Messrs. Brown, Cottman and Bowie, to join the gentlemen appointed by your honorable body.
