

“And be it enacted, That in case of death, resignation or removal from the State, as the case may be, of any one of said commisscioners, the remaining two shall appoint some suitable person to fill the vacancy, who shall qualify as hereinbefore provided.”

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

SATURDAY, February 24, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the petition of Henry Shreeves, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief o Henry Shreeves,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Read the third time by special order, [passed and [sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the petition of Josiah Marsh and others, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to a certain road in Baltimore county,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the memorial of Louis Howell and others, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland and New York Iron and Coal Company,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Brown from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Walter H. S. Mitchell, administrator of John Edelen,

The resolution directing the Treasurer for the Western Shore to pay to Springfield academy the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars,

And, the resolution in favor of Bowling, Mills and Gardener, reported favorably thereon.
