Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Louisa B. Roe, wife of Thomas Roe of Caroline county, to execute a conveyance of certain real estate therein named,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Basil . Hall, of Anne Arundel county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Lee and Goldsborough.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Theresa Kann of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Julius Kann,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorcees.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act supplemental to the act to incorporate the Chester Silk Company, passed at December session 1837, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Henke of Frederick county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
