

WEDNESDAY, February 28, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Beckett from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Rebecca Uncles, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Daniel H. Schleigh of Washington county, an insolvent debtor, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following messages:
