They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed December session, 1835, chapter 201, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Louisa B. Roe, wife of Thomas Roe of Caroline county, to execute a conveyance of certain real estate therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the clerk of Worcester county court to record a deed therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add:

“Provided, this act shall not interfere with the rights of any bona fide purchaser or purchasers, or judgment creditor, without notice.”

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
