

SATURDAY, March 3, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent submitted the following resolution,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

Read the third time, by special order, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States, from the State of Maryland, be requested to obtain a survey, by the Government of the United States, of the harbor of Annapolis and the Severn river, in this State.

Mr. Goldsborough, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act for the relief and benefit of Samuel Huebener, of Frederick county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment;

Which was read and assented to.

"Provided the said Huebener shall pay all cost and legal charge accrued in said case, and provided the court before whom the said prosecution is pending shall be of opinion that this act does not interfere with any vested right of the plaintiff or informer."

The bill was then read the second time and further amended, on the motion of Mr. Ricaud, by adding the following:

"Then and in that case this act shall be so construed as to release the said Huebener from so much of said fines and forfeitures as shall accrue to the state."

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The bill was then read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bruce from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act providing for the appointment of clerks of the several county courts, clerks of the Courts of Appeals for the Eastern and Western Shore, the clerk of Baltimore city court and the registers of wills in the several counties of this state, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.
