

Mr. Bruce from the committee to which was referred the resolution in favor of Jonathan Barkdall, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of Abingdon Academy, and

A resolution in favor of Battle Creek Academy,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled an act to authorise the commissioners of the tax, for Carroll county to borrow money for the erection of the public buildings,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Lee, Jones and Tidball.

A bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled an act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, passed in 1801, chapter 54,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Wright and Purnell.

A bill entitled an act for the rebuilding a certain bridge therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Hambleton and Tidball.

A bill entitled an act for the relief of Morris Malsby of Harford county,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on insolvency.

A bill entitled an act incorporating the Manchester military band of music,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

A bill entitled an act to divorce Thomas Meade of Calvert county, from his wife Sophia Meade,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

And returned the resolution which originated in the Senate relative to a survey of the Annapolis harbor endorsed, "assented to."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled a supplement to the act entitled an act to authorise John Armstrong of Baltimore county to hold real estate, passed at December session, 1828, chapter 48, endorsed "will pass."

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to prohibit the transportation of absconding slaves to Hayti or elsewhere, passed at December session 1824, chapter 85, was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.
