The preamble and resolutions relating to Joseph Ennals, was read the third time, dissented from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones submitted the following message; which was read and adopted:

By the Senate, March 3, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing the appointment of a joint committee to investigate and report to the General Assembly, the proceedings of the Board of Visitors and Governors of St. John's College, and concur therein. We have appointed Messrs. Jones, Cottman and Wright, to join the gentlemen selected by your honorable body.

A message endorsed "Executive business," was received from His-Excellency Governor Veazey, by the hands of John H. Culbreth, Esquire.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of Executive business, and after being sometime engaged therein.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The Senate resumed the consideration of Legislative business.

Mr. Kent from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the rebuilding a certain bridge therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the third line of the 1st section, strike out the word "two" and insert "four."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The 29th rule of the Senate, was amended by adding thereto the

words "and the messenger."

Mr. Bruce presented the memorial of S. M. Semmes, that he may be indemnified for all improvements he may erect on a certain lot situate in the Town of Cumberland, in the event of his present title thereto being found defective.

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial pro-

ceedings.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.
