because they believe the survey has been well conducted by the two scientific gentlemen, to whom it has been entrusted, that it has been productive of good results, that one of the most interesting portions of the State remains to be examined, and because, in the opinion of your committee, it would be unwise to arrest a work of such auspicious promise, at the present stage of its approximation to completion.
