Mr. Bruce from the committees to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heir at law of Richard Beall, late of Allegany county, deceased, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

In the 2d line of the preamble, after the word "lands" insert "situate"

At the end of the same line, strike out the word "situate."

At the end of the bill add:

"If the said purchase shall be approved of by the orphans court of Allegany county, and the said purchase when so made and approved of, shall vest the title to said life estate in said heir at law."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, March 7, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. Mr. Thomas, (Pres't.) appeared in the Senate Chamber and resumed the chair.

The bill entitled, an act to perpetuate the name of Ellicott's mills on the Patapsco falls, reported that the committees were of opinion said bills ought not to pass.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third

time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent from the committees to which were referred the bill entitled, an act to regulate the per diem allowance of the members of the Levy court in Charles county, and

The bill entitled, an act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, passed in 1801, chapter 54, reported fa-

vorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Gentlemen of the Senate, We respectfully return to your honorable body, the bill entitled, an
