Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Bruce and Goldsborough.

Mr. Kent from the committees to which were referred the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to authorise the laying out and opening a road through a part of Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, and

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the Trustees of the Alms-house in Prince George's county, to alter the time of appointing an Overseer and other officers and servants of said institution, and for other purposes, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolutions in favor of Barbara Ruark, and Elizabeth Burk, reported favorably thereon.
