

MONDAY, March 12, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the tax for Carroll county to borrow money for the erection of the public buildings, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the 5th line after the word "expenses," insert "which are now or may hereafter be "

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball presented the petition of Hanson Jones a free man of color of Washington county, for authority to remove into this State, and live with his wife a free woman of color,

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored population.

Mr. Brown submitted the following message; which was read and adopted:
