

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act to authorise Henry C. Drury, of William, former collector of taxes in the first collection district of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collections, passed at December session 1836, chapter 145,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Beckett and Bruce.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Anne White of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Bennet A. White,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

A bill entitled, an act to limit the number of constables in the several election districts in Anne Arundel county, and to increase their fees,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Beckett and Bruce.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of Edward L. Nicholson and others, devisees and legatees of Richard Harwood, of Thomas, deceased, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Lee from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Orphan House and Episcopal Free School of All Saints Church in Fredericktown, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to guard against frauds in the exercise of the elective franchise in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had instructed him to say that, in their opinion it ought to pass.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Mineral Bank of Maryland, reported favorably thereon.
