The bill entitled, an act for the relief of James H. Dorsey of Harford county, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house

of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington.

By the Senate,

March 14, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We herewith return to your honorable body the bill entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons, inhabitants of this State. The Senate cordially approve of the object of the bill—but would suggest to your honorable body, that the bill be so amended as to provide that the sum proposed to be appropriated, be taken from the interest accruing upon the surplus revenue. If the bill be so amended (the Senate not having the power to amend it) it will be favorably considered by this body.
