It was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The Senate proceeded again to the consideration of Executive business, and after being some time engaged therein.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The Senate resumed the consideration of Legislative business. The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

## THURSDAY, March 15, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Kent from the committees to which was referred the bill entitled an additional supplement to an act entitled an act to lay out and open a road in St. Mary's county passed at the December session 1836, chapter 208, and

The bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled an act to allow Henry C. Drury, former collector of taxes in the first election district of Anne Arundel county further time to complete his collec-

tions, passed at December session 1836, chapter 145, and

The bill entitled an act to authorise Charles Boone, former collector of taxes in the second election district of Anne Arundel county, further time to complete his collections, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The President announced the order of the day,—being the report and resolutions submitted by Mr Tidball, relative to the location of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road.

They were being read, when,

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

They were postponed and made the order of the day for to-morrow

(Friday) the 16th inst.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act to authorise the opening of a road through a part of Baltimore and Carroll counties, as therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.
