The bill entitled an act to incorporate the Susquehanna Boom Company, was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Read the third time, by special order, passed, and sent to the

house of delegates.

Mr. Wright from the committee to which was referred the bill entiled a further supplement to act entitled an act to provide for the instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State, passed at December session 1825, chapter 162, reported favorably thereon;

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following bills:

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled an act to incorporate the proprietors of the Green Mount Cemetery.

A bill entitled an act to incorporate the Watchman's Beneficial

Society of Baltimore.

A bill entitled an act to incorporate the German Beneficial Society of the State of Maryland, and

A bill entitled an act to incorporate the Union Academy.

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

A bill entitled an act to divorce William R. Sheffield of the city

of Baltimore from his wife Mary Elizabeth Sheffield,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

A bill entitled an act for the preservation of wild fowl in the waters of Swan creek, Spesutia narrows, Rumney creek, Bush river and Gunpawder river and the waters of Anne Arundel county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown,

Kent and Wright.

A bill entitled an act to extend the powers of the commissioners of the town of Havre de Grace, in Harford county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Tidball.

A bill entitled an act authorising and directing the commissioners of Harford county to levy a sum of money for the building of a bridge over Broad creek, at or near Cox's mill,
