

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Jones and Tidball.

A bill entitled an act for the relief of Mary Ann Pennington, of Kent county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wright, Hambleton and Beckett.

Mr. Jones, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act directing the commissioners of Harford county to publish annually a full statement of their receipts and disbursements, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Add the following section to the bill:

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the trustees of the alms house shall furnish the commissioners of the county with a general statement of all the disbursements and expenditures of said institution, from the year eighteen hundred and thirty four, (inclusive;) and it shall be the duty of the said commissioners to publish the same, agreeably to the provisions of the second section of this act.

The bill entitled an act to confirm an act entitled an act providing for the appointment of clerks of the several county courts, the clerks of the courts of appeals for the eastern and western shores, the cl'k of Baltimore city court, and the registers of wills in the several counties of this State, was read the third time, and the question put, "Shall the bill pass?"

The yeas and nays were asked for, and on taking them they appeared as follows:

So it was determined in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
