Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, a supplement to the charter of the Tide-wa'rer Canal Company,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

corporations.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the condemnation of a piece of ground at the upper ferry, in Somerset county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Cottman,

Purnell and Goldsborough.

And returned the resolutions which originated in the Senate, rela-

tive to the currency, endorsed "assented to."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland academy of Fine Arts, endorsed "will pass pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which were read, and with the bill,

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Referred to the committee on corporations, and were as follows.

In the 6th line of the 1st section, after the word "estate" insert "not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars."

At the end of the 3d section add:

"As the directors of the said company may direct."

At the end of the 8th section add:

"Until it be otherwise directed by law."

Mr. Kent presented the memorial of Rezin Hammond and others, for certain relief.

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial pro-

ceedings.

Mr. Kent from the committee on the militia, to which was referred the resolution in relation to furnishing certain tents to the Colonel of the 50th regiment of the militia, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to be assented to.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, dissen-

ted from and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled a supplement to the charter of the Tide-wate Canal Company, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Purnell from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution relating to Cokesbury academy in Harford county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented

to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of the Great Council of Maryland of the Improved Order of Red Men, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,
