On motion of Mr. Lee,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of George A. Dashiell of Somerset county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

Add the following section:

Sec. 2, And be it enacted, That upon the payment of the whole purchase money to the trustee and not before, the said trustee is hereby authorised and empowered to convey by a good and sufficient deed, the estate by him sold, to the purchaser or purchasers, his, her or their heirs and assigns in fee simple.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills

A bill entitled, an act to prevent unnecessary accumulation of costs in cases of appeal,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to amend the Constitution and Form of Government of the State of Maryland,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Lee, Wright and Brown.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, endorsed "will pass."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise John Lammott, former collector in the third collection district in Baltimore county, to complete his collections, endorsed "will not pass."
