

a majority of the voters of Anne Arundel county shall declare their assent thereto at the election to be held on the first Wednesday in October next.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The bill was read the third time by special order, and the question put,

“Shall the bill pass?”

The yeas and nays were asked for, and on taking them they appeared as follows:

#### AFFIRMATIVE.

So it was determined in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wright,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Wright, Bowie and Goldsborough, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to alter the divisional line between the first and third election districts in Carroll county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to alter the time for holding the county courts in Harford county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid a deed of conveyance from Daniel Renner to Susannah Jenkins, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add:

“Provided that nothing in this act contained, shall be construed to prejudice the rights and claims of any bona fide or judgment creditor or creditors of the said Daniel Renner.”

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
