Mr. Bowie from the said committee, reported a bill entitled, an act allowing a certain case to be reinstated in Baltimore county court.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and

ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and On motion of Mr. Bowie,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Jones.

Leave was granted to Messrs. Jones, Cottman and Hambleton, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to an act to provide for electing commissioners for Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session, 1826, chapter 217.

The pill entitled, an act to authorise Mrs. Mary Bond and John McKenny, to manumit certain negroes, was read the third time, re-

jected and returned to the house of delegates.

colored population.

A bill entitled a supplement to an act of Assembly passed the 9th of February, 1836, chap 41, entitled an act to authorise and empower the surveyor of Frederick county to cause an alphabetical record entry to be made of all the original land certificates in said county, in the surveyor's office,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled an act to revise and alter the divisional line between election districts number one and number ten in Allegany county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bruce.

Tidball and Kent.

A bill entitled an act to divorce James Weston of Talbot county, from his wife Ann J. Weston,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

A bill entitled an act to authorise the commissioners of Harford county to settle certain claims therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Jones,

Wright and Tidball,

A bill entitled an act for the relief of Reuben Tall, former sheriff and collector of Dorchester county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Goldsborough, Hambleton and Purnell
