Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Register of the Land Office for the Western Shore, be and he is hereby directed to correct all errors in a patent issued to Andrew Bruce of Allegany county, on the 18th day of December 1805, for a tract of land called "Resurvey on Mount Pleasant," so as to make said patent correspond with the courses of the original certificate of survey, upon which said patent issued.
