

Sec. 3 last line, after the word "aforesaid" add:

"And provided the said compensation be equal and uniform amongst all the supervisors of said county."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committees to which were referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the administrators of Preston McComas late sheriff of Harford county, and

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of jurors in Carroll county, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act declaratory of the laws concerning contempts of courts, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the petition of John A. Carter, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise John A. Carter, to bring into this State certain slaves therein mentioned.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough,

Read the third time, by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise John E. Taylor, to bring into this State, a negro boy named Lewis, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the petition of Hanson Jones, for authority to bring his wife a free woman of color into this State, reported that the committee were of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner ought not to be granted.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Said petition was recommitted to the committee on colored population, with instructions to report a bill in conformity with the prayer of the petitioner.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make a public landing and road therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment.
