Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Silk Company of Somerset county,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Alexander Donoho of Somerset county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman also presented the petition of Noah Rider and others, for authority to make certain changes in the streets of the town of Salisbury,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Cottman, Hambleton and Goldsborough.

The committee on colored population, who were "instructed to inquire into and report to the Senate, the expediency of adhering to the policy and provisions of the Acts of Assembly prohibiting the introduction of slaves into this State; and that the said committee ascertain as far as practicable, how many slaves have been brought into the
