The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

The reading of the proceedings of yesterday was dispensed with. Mr. Cottman presented the petition of Juliet Done, for authority to bring her slave Jane into this State.

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored population. Mr. Hambleton from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Anne Lawrentz, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented

to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Carroll White Sulphur Spring Company, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message,

By the House of Delegates, March 23, 1838.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We herewith send you a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act relating to free negroes and slaves, and respectfully ask you to reconsider and pass the same.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Kent and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Francis Stevens, late sheriff of Calvert county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Beckett, Kent and Bowie.
