Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

corporations.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs at law of David

Moore, and

A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county court, passed at December session 1828,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to fix the per diem allowance for the support and maintenance of prisoners in the jail of Harford county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Jones,

Tidball and Wright.

A bill entitled, a further sepplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out and open a new road in Frederick and Baltimore counties, passed at December session 1832, chapter 23,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Jones,

Cottman and Lee.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of John Leatherbury, collector of Somerset county, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the petition of Juliet Done, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise Juliet

Done to bring into this State her slave Jane,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Wright,

The bill entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of the judges of the levy court, commissioners of the tax and witnesses for Kent county, was read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce William Start of Queen

Anne's county, from his wife Catharine Start, and

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Sally Anne Porter of Talbot county, from her husband James Porter, reported favorably thereon.
