Strike out in the last line "without fee or reward," and insert, "by the said individual so appointed furnishing his own screws, and paying to the said Inspector of Tobacco of Warehouse No. 4, for the use of the State, the sum of twenty-five cents, for each and every hogshead of Tobacco so shook out and conditioned, and it shall be the duty of said inspector to make return thereof to the treasurer of the Western Shore."
