

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act to fix the per diem allowance for the support and maintenance of prisoners in the jail of Harford county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones, from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill entitled an act for the benefit of the trustees of the Catholic Cathedral church of Baltimore, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment;

Which was read and assented to:

Add as an additional section:

Sec. And be it enacted, That nothing in this act contained shall prejudice the rights at law or in equity of the heirs of the said John Charles Francis Chirac.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled a further supplement to the act entitled an act to lay out and open a new road in Frederick and Baltimore counties, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 23, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

Add the following section:

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of Baltimore county be and they are hereby required to pay over the amount to be levied and assessed under the provisions of the first section of this act to the said Alexander Gillis and Greenbury Shipley, on or before the first day of December next.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act to amend the constitution and form of government, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Purnell, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution relative to the profession of physic in the university of Maryland, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Purnell from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled an act for the relief of Peter Causey, of Worcester county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment:

Which was read and assented to:

At the end of the 1st line, after the word "levy," insert "court."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
