A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to invest the States' share of the surplus revenue of the United States and for other purposes, passed at December session 1836, chapter 220,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the commissioners of the tax for Carroll county, to fence in a garden at the jail of said county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Lee, Tidball and Cottman.

A bill entitled, an act for the promotion of education in Allegany county, by means of the poor school fund of said county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bruce, Tidball and Lee.

A bill entitled, an act for the preservation of fish and wild fowl in the Patuxent and Wicomico rivers, and their tributaries,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Purnell, Cottman and Beckett.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Daniel Griffith of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Margaret Griffith,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.
