Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Benjamin Hopkins,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Beckett and Bruce.

And returned the following bills which originated in the Senate,

severally endorsed "will pass."

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State, so far as the same relates to Kent county,

The bill entitled, an act to enable Hanson Jones, a free man of color, to bring into Washington county his wife Priscilla Hanson, form-

erly Priscilla Johnson, a woman of color, and

The bil. entitled, an act to amend and explain an act entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary subools throughout this State, passed December session 1825, chapter 162, so far as relates to Montgomery county.

On motion of Mr. Lee,

Leave was granted by special order, to Messrs. Lee, Tidball and Jones, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act to prevent gaming, passed at December session 1826, chapter 88.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act in relation to the stock formerly held by the Bank of Maryland, in certain Turnpike road companies, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Cottman,

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act to prevent the destruction of oysters in the waters of this State, passed at December session 1833, chapter 254, with the amendment heretofore offered, were taken up for consideration.

The said amendment was as follows: At the end of the 2nd section add:

"Provided, That nothing herein contained shall effect in any manner the citizens of counties not bordering on the Chesapeake bay"

The question was put upon assenting to said amendment,

And determined in the negative.

The bill was then read through, and the question put,

"Shall the bill pass?"
