found not to correspond with the legal standards, at the custom house in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state and to prescribe their jurisdiction.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Samuel Keplinger, of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Mary Keplinger, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations, to which was referred the memorial of the Maryland Insurance Company, reported a bill entitled, an act further to continue an act, passed at November session 1795, entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Insurance Company.

Which was read the first time.

His Excellency Governor Veazey, appeared in the Senate Chamber.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

It was ordered, that a deputation consisting of Messrs. Ricaud and Tidball, be appointed to inform the house of delegates that His Excellency the Governor elect, is now in the Senate Chamber, prepared to qualify according to the constitution and laws of this State, and request their attendance to witness the ceremony.

Accordingly, Messrs. Ricaud and Tidball retired, and after a time returned and reported that they had discharged the duty assigned them.

The Honorable Speaker and members of the house of delegates appeared in the Senate Chamber—when the oaths of office were administered by the President of the Senate, to His Excellency Thomas W. Veazey, in the presence of the General Assembly, in conformity with the requirements of the constitution and the laws.

The Honorable Speaker and members of the house of delegates retired.

His Excellency the Governor, also retired.

The Senate adjourned until to morrow morning ten o'clock,
