TUESDAY, January 9, 1838.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday.
The proceedings of Saturday and yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act further to continue an act, passed at November session 1795, entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Insurance Company, passed by the Senate on Saturday, was sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton presented the petition of William Harris, praying to be divorced from his wife E. L. Harris, *a vinculo matrimonii*,

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

The President laid before the Senate a report from the commissioners of Lotteries,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a report from the clerk of Queen Anne's county court, relative to the attendance of the judges of the Second Judicial District of Maryland,

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The President laid before the Senate letters from William F. Johnson and Thomas G. Pratt, Esquires, members elect of the Council, accepting their appointments,

Which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud presented the memorial of Doctors David Davis and Peregrine Wroth, in behalf of the Physicians of Kent county, praying Legislative aid in the subjects therein set forth,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ricaud, Bowie and Tidball.

Mr. Ricaud presented the petition of Richard Ringgold, of Kent county, praying the passage of an act to make valid a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Ricaud, Wright and Goldsborough, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and
