The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the commissioners court of Calvert county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Beckett,

Kent and Bowie.

Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act extending the time of the Statutes of Limitations as applied to claims against real estate,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on ju-

dicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

pensions.

A bill entitled, an act to release John Jones, from confinement in Baltimore county court,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on

insolvency.

A bill entitled, an act to repair injuries done by fire from Rail Road Engines,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on ju-

dicial proceedings.

And returned the resolutions which originated in the Senate, requesting our Representatives in Congress, to endeavor to procure from the general government, further aid towards the completion of

the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, endorsed "assented to."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement, by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and assented to, and was as follows:

At the end of the bill add:

"Provided, that nothing in this act shall be so construed as to release said company from its obligations to make a second track whenever the Legislature of this State shall require it."

Also, returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Boston and New York Coal Company, passed December session 1835, endorsed "will pass."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections and to regulate said elections, passed at December session 1832, chapter 275, endorsed "will pass."
