1st section 1st line, strike out all after the word "Maryland," to the end of the bill, and insert:

That the levy court of Worcester county, be and they are hereby authorised, if they shall consider it expedient, whenever the division of said county into school districts shall be complete, to apply the free school funds of said county in such manner and proportions, annually between said school districts as will be equitable, and so as to encourage the establishment of schools as soon as may be in each district, and may direct their assets accordingly; provided, that the said court shall not apply or apportion in any one year, more than the sum received in the same year from the Treasurer of the Western Shore and the interest of the school funds belonging to said county.

Sec. 2, And be it enacted, That if any part of the sum so apportioned shall not be applied to the education of such persons as are authorised by law to receive the benefit of said fund in any district. to which it may be apportioned, it shall revert to the free school fund of said county, subject to the disposition of the levy court, in the same manner as other free school funds.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Henry Thompson of the city of Annapolis, to sell and dispose of his negro girl Emily Johnson, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State, reported that the committee were of opinion they ought not to pass.
