The bill entitled, an act relating to Chancery proceedings, was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Purnell from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make valtd a certain deed therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add:

Provided, this act shall not affect the right of any bona fide purchaser without notice, or judgment creditor.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Worcester county court to record a deed therein mentioned, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Provided, this act shall not affect any bona fide purchaser, without notice.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the promotion of education in Somerset county, reported favorably thereon.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following resolutions:
