Mr. Ricaud from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to exempt the sheriff of Cecil county, from the collection of officers fees,

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert M. Walmsby, and The bill entitled, an act to secure to the citizens of Allegany county, the right of trial for debt under warrant, in the election district in which the party so sued may reside, reported that the committee were of opinion they ought not to pass.
