Mr. Bowie from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the resolutions relating to the election of directors in the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, also in relation to the deposite of the funds of said company, reported that the committee were of opinion they ought to be assented to with the following amendments,

Which were read and assented to:

After the word "State," in 5th line of 2nd resolution, insert the words, "so far as the same can be used to advantage by the said Banks, and will not cause internal loss or inconvenience to said company."

The resolutions were then read the second and by special order the third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Anne Ennalls Harris, wife of William T. Harris, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

The amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act to provide for electing commissioners for Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 217, were read and assented to.

Mr. Purnell from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to alter the place of holding elections in the fourth or Berlin district, in Worcester county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise commissioners to open and make public a road on the Patuxent river, near John Holton's in St. Mary's county, reported that the committee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Add, at the end of the last section:

Provided, that nothing in this act contained, shall deprive any owner of land who is dissatisfied with the assessment of the commissioners herein named, or who is an infant, feme covert or non compos

mentis, of the benefit of a trial by jury, in the usual form of inquisitions "ad quod danum."
