The bill was then read through the second and by special order

the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Tidball from the committees to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county, to build a bridge over the Antietam creek, at Lewis Zegler's ford,

The bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of Assembly which would expire with the present session of the General Assem-

bly, and

The bill entitied, an act to increase the allowance to the sheriff of Washington county for keeping debtors in goal, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a Bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Washington County Bank, at the Town of Williamsport in Washington county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 183, was recommitted to Messrs. Tidball, Jones and Brown.

Mr. Jones from the committee on insolvency, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to release John Jones from confinement in Baltimore county goal, reported that the committee were of opinion

it ought not to pass.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud submitted the following report,

Which was read and concurred in.

The joint committee appointed to contract for the public printing under the provisions of the act of 1831, chapter 303, beg leave to REPORT:

That they have contracted with Jeremiah Hughes, for the printing of the laws that may be passed by the next General Assembly, on the following terms: sixteen hundred copies, at two dollars and fifty cents per page, each page to contain sixteen hundred and fifty ems.

That they have contracted with the same gentleman for the printing of the journal of the next house of delegates, and such other public printing as may be required by that body, on the following terms,

VIZ:

Journal, 1600 copies at \$2 per page, each page to contain 1450 ems; the ayes and noes to be inserted in three, instead of two columns as heretofore. No extra allowance to be made for the current journal.

Bills, \$1 per page, each page to contain 22 lines of six inches in length—106 copies to be furnished.

Pamphlets and reports at the rate of \$1 per page, for 106 copies.

Broadsides, at the rate of \$7, for 106 copies.
